### 1. Log into your student's account on the Virtual University platform.

The Virtual University (WU) is our online student support platform where you will find all the necessary data about class schedules, changes, personal and financial data; and also to enrol for your classes before the start of every semester.

This will help you to stay up to date, and you will be able to ask questions, get your answers, advice and assistance during your studies.

# 2. Attend an obligatory organizational meeting

The orientation meeting is organized for the first year students to provide informational support on their first day at the University, share valuable and useful information about the studies and life in Poland. On this meeting students do usually receive their student ID cards.

# VIRTUAL UNIVERSITY

The Virtual University (WU) is our online student support system: www.wu.lazarski.pl, and you can also download the Lazarski app on your smartphone.

To log into your WU account, you need your student number (which doubles as your username) and string of characters given in the account activation email. After the first login you will be prompted to change your password. If you ever forget your password, you can contact the IT department



# LIFE IN POLAND

# SAVOIRE VIVRE

There are some important laws to know about for your life in Poland, as breaking them will result in large fines or troublesome situations (and as international students this may affect your right to live in Poland). These are some of the most important ones to remember: You are always required to have an identity document with you in case you are stopped by the Police or Immigration Officers. Be sure to also have documentation that proves your right to be in Poland (e.g. your visa or Karta Pobytu) and your student card. Failure to comply will result in substantial fines.

You are not allowed to drink in public places in Poland (e.g. parks, streets, etc), and you can get a large fine (as a minimum) if you are caught drinking in such places. Additionally, Poland has a zero tolerance and limit to drinking and driving (i.e. you may not drink at all if you plan to drive, as the legal limit is 0.00) – failure to comply will result in very serious consequences.

Smoking is forbidden at public transport stops, as well as in public buildings (e.g. restaurants, airports, offices, bars, etc) or 100 metres from their entrances. Some bars and institutions have designated smoking areas. Breaking this law may result in fines of 500PLN or more.

Pedestrians have right of way in most situations, but you may not cross the street illegally – always use designated crossing areas. Failure to do so is not only dangerous but can also result in fines.

When using public transport, you are always required to have a valid ticket for the duration of your journey. You will be fined 266 PLN for not having a ticket, and 196 PLN for not having your document that confirms your right to a discounted ticket (i.e. student card).

# PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Public Transport (ZTM) in Warsaw is very efficient and affordable. As students you will be able to use your student card as your transport card, benefitting from a student discount at the same time. You can find more information from the public transport authority: www.ztm.waw.pl

We recommend you purchase a 90 day ticket for 140PLN, which is the cheapest option. You can load your ticket using the red ZTM machine on the campus (at the entrance to Sector A).

You can easily calculate your routes to and from the University (and many other destinations around Poland) using www. warszawa.jakdojade.pl

## **BANK ACCOUNT**

International students are able to open a bank account at any bank they wish and typically only need their passport. There are many banks to choose from, and you can simply go to any branch of any bank and open a suitable account.

Students who wish to work part-time in Poland can do so on the basis of their student visa. It is important to remember that your visa is only valid to study, work and live in Poland (not any other European country); and that your primary purpose of staying in Poland is to study, therefore active participation in your.
