ABOUT THE INTERNATIONAL SCIENTIFIC CONFERENCE

The International Scientific Conference on “European Experience of Migration - Approaches, Challenges and Opportunities” is held on February 9-10, 2023, in Tbilisi, under the aegis of the European Integration Research Center, operating at Georgian National University SEU. The Lazarski University (Poland) is the co-organizer of the Conference.

At the beginning of the 21st century, along with the growth of the migration movement, the protection of migrants' rights, the regulation of migration processes by the states, the issues of the state's sovereignty, its security, and, at the same time, internal socio-political conflicts became relevant.

This conference is the best way for local and international researchers and policymakers to discuss the results of modern academic research and present a wide range of issues related to migration in a more general - European and international perspective.

Both experienced and young scientists, including doctoral students from Georgia and European Union, will participate in the conference.

As the conference is interdisciplinary, the papers can be accepted about the following topics:

- ✓ Migration and Development – Causes of Migration and Responses;
- ✓ Migration as a human right and as a social challenge;
- ✓ Attitudes towards migrants - integration and reintegration;
- ✓ Illegal migration – violation of the law or an opportunity?
- ✓ Eco-Migration - Impact of Climate Change on Migration;
- ✓ Post-Pandemic Asylum Seeking and Seeker Reception Procedures;
- ✓ War and Migration - Economic, Political and Existential Crisis.

The conference papers will be published in the special edition of the scientific journal “Vectors of Social Sciences” of Georgian National University SEU or in a journal of Faculty of Economics and Management of Lazarski University “Economic and Political Thought”.

ABOUT GEORGIAN NATIONAL UNIVERSITY SEU

Georgian National University SEU firmly maintains the status of the most demanded private university in Georgia.

SEU is a university oriented on unceasing development with one of the best campuses in the world, modern academic programs, highly qualified staff and well-developed student services. SEU has fully adapted to the European management and quality assurance standards, which in turn, has led to extensive organisational changes.

SEU has invited experts from the leading German international advisory group on European higher education, whose portfolio includes reforms of educational and research institutions around the world. SEU has been collaborating with them for more than 2 years, and during this time, the university has invested more than 2 million GEL in organisational development and quality improvement.

However, the university has managed to face all the challenges in a way to maintain its core value of student-centeredness, manifested not only in financial incentives and deferrals but the donation of more than 1400 Lenovo laptops to its students, to make sure the online learning to run smoothly and flawlessly.

The successful operation of SEU was reaffirmed on June 10, 2021, when the university was granted unconditional authorization. SEU received the highest evaluation from Georgian and foreign experts, while the existing achievements were recognized as best practices.

Currently, SEU provides 4 faculties and 18 accredited (undergraduate, graduate, one-step) educational programs in Business, Law, Social Sciences, Tourism and Medicine, with up to 8000 students and 500 academic and invited staff. 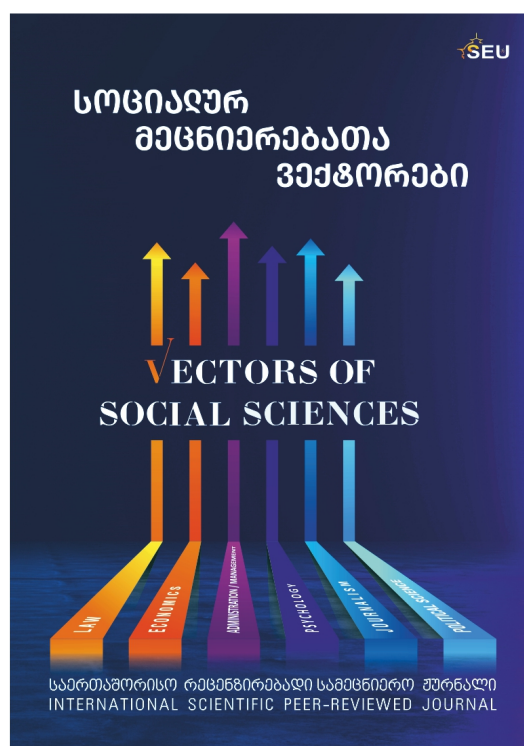
