EU Internal Market Law

Aims and Learning Outcomes:

The course will examine the functioning of the EU internal market. Student shall learn basic mechanisms of free movement freedoms – free movement of goods, services, persons and capital and payments. During the course students will learn how to interpret relevant provisions of Treaty on the Functioning of the EU and will explore case-law of the European Court of Justice.

Art. 30 TFEU - Customs union; Art. 110 TFEU – Internal taxation; ECJ case-law
3. Free movement of goods
Introduction to the scope of art. 34-36 TFEU – Notion of quantitative restrictions and measures having equivalent effect (MEQR); ECJ case-law
4. Evolution of the ECJ case-law on MEQR – Dassonville, Cassis de Dijon, Keck, Mickelsson
Relation between Keck and Unfair Commercial Practices Directive
5. Derogations and justifications – art. 36 TFEU and „mandatory requirements”; ECJ case -law
6. Free movement of persons
Free movement of EU citizens; Free movement of workers; personal scope, material scope; ECJ case-law
7. Freedom of establishment

Personal scope, material scope, ECJ case-law

8. Free movement of services

Notion of a service; personal scope, material scope, ECJ case-law

9. Free movement of persons and services

Derogations and justifications: public policy, public security and public health,
Public service exception; ECJ case-law

10. Free movement of capital and payment

Notion of capital and payment; functioning of the freedom; its relation to Economic and Monetary Union, ECJ case-law

11. EU competition law
